About the Artists

Lila Brown (viola) is a co-founder and the artistic director of Music from Salem, founded in 1986, and director of the MfS Viola Seminar since 2011. A graduate of the Juilliard School, Brown was a member of the Boston Symphony from 1982-84. Moving to Austria, she studied with Sandor Vegh, and was principal violist of his Camerata Academica Salzburg. As a member of the Ensemble Modern, the renowned German ensemble for new music, Brown premiered works by Ligeti, Kurtag, Adams, Reich, Rhim, Zappa, and Lachenmann among others, and she has played chamber music tours of England with the International Musicians Seminar in Cornwall, England. Brown has been a participant at the Marlboro Music Festival and is a frequent guest artist at the Martha's Vineyard Chamber Music Society, Apple Hill Center for Chamber Music, the Boston Artists Ensemble and Horten Kammermusikkfest in Norway. She has been an assistant professor the Vienna Hochschule, professor at the Robert Schumann Musikhochschule in Duesseldorf, and returning to the US in 2009, joined the faculty of The Boston Conservatory where she received a "Distinguished Music Faculty of the Year" award in 2012.

Bitran, first violinist with the award-winning Latinoamericano since 1986, is a recipient of the highest artistic awards given by Mexico and Chile, namely the Bellas Artes Medal and the Order of Merit Pablo Neruda. The Cuarteto Latinoamericano, winner of Latin Grammys in 2012 and 2016 as well as the Diapason d'or in 2007, is known worldwide as the main exponent of the string quartet literature by Latin American composers, which the quartet has recorded in over 70 CDs, for international labels. These albums have become the reference recordings for this repertoire. The sixth and last volume of the Heitor Villa-Lobos Ouartets cycle, recorded for Dorian, was nominated for two Grammys in 2002. Saul is concertmaster of Unitas Ensemble, a Boston-based orchestra committed to introduce Latin American repertoire to US audiences. Many of his former students hold important positions in the international music scene. Saul has been Associate Professor and Artist in Residence at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, and Artist-in Residence at the College of the Holy Cross.

Jonathan Brin earned a Bachelors of Music at the Eastman School of Music studying with Steven Doane, and while at the school founded the Hyperion String Quartet. As a member of the quartet, he continued schooling at Kent State, the Hartt School, and San Diego State University. The Quartet has held residencies with The Sembrich Opera Museum, Empire State Youth Orchestra, Young Audiences, and New Performing Arts of Kentucky, and has been prizewinners at the Coleman, Fischoff, Green Lake, and MTNA competitions. Jonathan is a member of the Vermont Symphony and the Lake Placid Sinfonietta, and is also on faculty at Skidmore College and the College of Saint Rose. In addition, he performs regularly with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra.
